



## House Rules for Dogs

Nobody wants to leave their four legged friend behind when going for a relaxing break away, and at Talland Bay Hotel you don't have to.

We realise that your pets need a break too; so we provide a complimentary pamper pack with their own comfort blanket and tasty treats. A holiday together deserves to be celebrated, so why not start straight away at Talland Bay Hotel.

We do hope that you and your dogs enjoy our beautiful hotel. To assist you in achieving this we have a few simple requests.

- Firstly, please let us know when booking if you plan to bring your dog, so that we can prepare for their visit.
- On arrival we ask you to complete a dog registration form and contract, which covers responsibility for any damage that might be caused by your dog during their stay.
- Your dogs are welcome to wander with you in the grounds throughout the day. Please ask your dog to converse in the same hushed tones that you and our other two-legged guests also employ around the hotel.
- There are bins around the grounds for you to deposit your dog's daily gifts to the lawns, and there is a small supply of bags at reception should you forget your own or run out.
- Some of our guests may be allergic to dog hair or simply not as fond of our four legged friends as we are, and do not like to see them on the seating. There is a supply of doggy blankets available at reception to protect the lounge furniture and we would ask you to collect one of these if you are going to invite your smaller dogs onto the seating. Larger dogs are welcome to curl up on the carpet.
- Not everyone enjoys a canine companion during meal times. For this reason we keep the Terrace restaurant as a 'dog free' area during service of all meals. You are welcome to dine with your dog in the Conservatory or the bar where dogs should be on the floor at all times.
- Please refrain from using the bath to clean your dog. There is an outside tap at the back of the residents' lounge.
- Our experience with dogs at Talland Bay is a very good one and little offence or damage is ever caused to anyone. We make a small paw print charge of £15 per dog, per night and for this small contribution your little friend will get a sausage breakfast and a chicken dinner whenever you dine with us.
